



2010 AK-SAR-BEN COMMUNITY COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

INSTRUCTIONS

The Ak-Sar-Ben Community College Scholarship Program is funded by the Ak-Sar-Ben Friends Organization- a membership group from across the region that supports the Knights of Ak-Sar-Ben Foundation mission. It was created to reward outstanding and talented community college-bound high school seniors, current community college students and those planning to enroll. Students must be Heartland residents (Nebraska and western Iowa) who need financial help to realize their potential.

THE CRITERIA:

- Leadership potential
- Academic achievement
- Desire to earn a degree
- Financial need

Applications are due in the community college financial aid office by March 15, 2010.

THE SCHOLARSHIP:

1. A maximum of 10 scholarships will be awarded for the 2010-2011 academic year.
2. The scholarship is a \$1000 award for one-year of full-time study to be applied toward tuition, fees and books and is subject to review by Ak-Sar-Ben at the end of the fall term. The \$1000 is paid in one installment, but is distributed in two \$500 installments through the college with the second payment dependent upon the student maintaining a 2.5 GPA and continuing to carry at least 12 hours.
3. Recipients must attend one of the community colleges in the Ak-Sar-Ben region (see list of eligible schools on page 2).
4. Each eligible community college in the Ak-Sar-Ben region is asked to submit up to six applications (if possible, three from graduating high school seniors and three from other students). **Your application must be submitted to the college financial aid office. Do not send your application directly to Ak-Sar-Ben.**
5. Scholarship recipients are required to be mentored by a college counselor.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE:

To apply for this award you must be:

- able to demonstrate financial need by submitting a complete, current Federal Student Aid Report (SAR)
- accepted for admission or enrolled at an eligible community college
- a United States citizen who is a resident of Nebraska or western Iowa (eligible Iowa counties listed on page 2)
- carrying a course load of at least 12 hours (or, as high school senior, planning to carry at least a 12-hour course load)

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS:

Submit the following items, in order, to your community college's financial aid office:

1. Application Form
2. Essay
3. Two completed reference forms in sealed envelopes (community college will open and attach to form)
4. One copy of the front and back side of page one of a completed Federal Student Aid Report (SAR)
5. High school seniors only: a transcript of your high school grades through the Fall 2009 term

The items above are explained below:

The Application Form. All of your responses to the questions on the form must be written in the space provided. Do not attach a separate page.

The Essay Questions. The essay questions are designed to help the judges develop a sense of your interests, abilities, motivation and personal circumstances. You should provide enough information about yourself to help them evaluate your personal qualifications for this scholarship. Note the maximum length specified for the essay length.

Two Reference Forms. You are required to submit two completed reference forms: one personal (from an adult non-family member) and one from a teacher or instructor. Two reference forms have been included in this application packet, one titled "Instructor Reference Form" and one titled "Personal Reference Form." You must print or type your name on the forms, and give a form to each of your two references. Ask them to return their completed and signed reference statements in sealed envelopes to you. Do not open the sealed envelopes; this would invalidate the reference. The reference forms must be submitted (still sealed) to your community college financial aid office with your application.

Federal Student Aid Report. You must have completed a current Application for Federal Student Aid (SAR) in time for the results to be submitted with your application for this scholarship. This form is available on line: (www.fafsa.ed.gov) or from your college financial aid office. Please submit the form AND the report. Check with the college financial aid office for further instructions.

High School Transcript. If you are currently a high school student, please include a certified original transcript of your high school grades through the Fall 2009 term.

SCHOLARSHIP RENEWAL

Students must maintain a 2.5 overall GPA to qualify for the second-term renewal of their scholarship. Students must also continue as full-time students (at least 12 hours).

RECIPIENT ACCOUNTABILITY

All recipients of Ak-Sar-Ben Community College Scholarships will be required to sign an agreement in which they pledge to use the scholarship grant only for expenses related to their education as defined by Ak-Sar-Ben, to provide Ak-Sar-Ben certain documentation of scholastic performance, and to supply to Ak-Sar-Ben any and all other information mandated by federal tax regulations.

ELIGIBLE COMMUNITY COLLEGES AND IOWA COUNTIES:

Community Colleges: Central, Metropolitan, Mid-Plains, Nebraska Indian, Northeast, Southeast and Western community colleges in Nebraska, Little Priest Tribal College in Nebraska, Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture, and Iowa Western, Northwest Iowa, Southwestern Iowa and Western Iowa Technical community colleges in Iowa.

Iowa Counties: Adair, Adams, Audubon, Buena Vista, Calhoun, Carroll, Cass, Cherokee, Clay, Crawford, Dickinson, Fremont, Greene, Guthrie, Harrison, Ida, Lyon, Mills, Monona, Montgomery, O'Brien, Osceola, Page, Pottawattamie, Plymouth, Ringold, Sac, Shelby Sioux, Taylor, Union, Woodbury.

Nebraska Counties: All Nebraska counties are eligible.
