## MCC Open House (South Campus) Saturday, January 26

Metropolitan Community College is hosting an Open House at their South Omaha Campus, 2902 Edward Babe Gomez Ave, on Saturday, January 26 from 10 a.m. to noon. Featured programs include automotive technology, cybersecurity, dental assisting, EMS, IT, legal/paralegal, manufacturing technology, medical assisting, precision machinery, and respiratory therapy. Attendees will learn more about scholarship opportunities, first year experience, CollegeNOW!, and gateway to college. Open house attendees may enter for the chance to win prizes, including one free class (up to 4.5 credit hours).

## Midwest Student Exchange Program

The Midwest Student Exchange Program (MSEP) is a tuition reduction program that makes attending out-of-state colleges and universities more affordable for non-resident students. By enrolling in a MSEP program at a participating institution, you will receive a reduced tuition rate. Over 140 colleges and universities in IN, KS, MI, MN, MO, NE, ND, and WI participate in the program.

### How does it work?

It is not a scholarship. Public institutions agree to charge students no more than 150% of the in-state resident tuition rate for specific programs; private institutions offer a 10% reduction on their tuition rates. You must enroll as a non-resident student at a participating MSEP campus to receive the discount.

**Juniors....The February 9 ACT** registration deadline is January 11. Register on-line at [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org) Before registering, make sure you check your schedule for February 9. Once you register you cannot get a refund, even if you are unable to test that day.

If you are a junior I highly suggest taking the ACT in February so you have plenty of opportunities to retake the test. Juniors will then take the John Baylor ACT prep class in March and April leading up to the April 3 state ACT test. The cost of taking the ACT test is \$50.50. If juniors receive free or reduced lunches, they make take the ACT up to two times for free. See Ms. Moser for the additional form.

**Students grades 9-12** Please see Ms. Moser in order to go over your new transcripts. Eligible sophomores through seniors will receive application information for National Honor Society if their cumulative GPA is higher than a 92%. Applications are due by March 15.
